FROM OUR PASTOR

Sue Miller (our Lay Leader) shared an interesting article with me the other day – it's by John Wentz, with Crosswalk Ministries.

The title is "How to Equip the Church to Flourish Post-Pandemic".

In this article he lifts up three images that he has seen in churches recently. The first is the "dog who has been inside too long" syndrome.—

You've seen this – the dog has so much pent-up energy that it can't wait to just get outside and jump and run and just go wild! And while passion is a great thing to have, activity without direction looks like fun but can end tragically. I have seen many a dog run into a tree, or a wall, or a street when it isn't paying attention. The dog/church has to tame itself and listen for the master's directions or it can get into trouble.

The second problem is the "Back to Normal" approach – we want things to just go back to what they were. But that approach ignores all of the lessons that God has been teaching us over the past year and a half. "Normal" wasn't working. The American church was dying at "normal". We had lost our influence on society, and we were not bringing the lost into the family. Even though some individual churches were doing well, as a whole the American church was shrinking. (Interesting that the growing churches were the ones who were focused on reaching those outside the church, not trying to take care of those who were already a part of it!)

The third approach is to "Stay In Our Bubbles". This approach is appealing – we've become comfortable with watching church on a screen in our pajamas, and limiting our contact with other people! We have home food delivery, online education, online preaching, separation while out in public. Many people have found that they prefer this way of life, and will continue whether the rest of society opens up or not.

Wentz suggests that each of these has their benefits – energy, desire to reconnect, continued safety practices – but the key question we should be asking is "**Are we listening?**"

Are we listening for God's directions? Are we like the dog just running off and excitedly doing whatever we want? Or, do we listen compassionately to those who just want to go back, but, invite them to come along with us to the next steps that God has planned for us?

Are we listening to the world, who still needs Jesus' touch? While the ways in which we connect with each other have changed, the need for connection has not. How can we be "high tech, high touch"?

I hope that you will meditate upon this. Over the next few months as people start returning to Marco, how will God offer His hope and healing through us?

SUNDAY MORNING, 10:00 AM

GRIEF SHARE AUTUMN UPDATE

Among the many helpful resources featured on the GriefShare website (www.griefshare.org) is an improved "Find a Group" search engine. Now you can use filters to narrow your search by meeting type (weekly GriefShare groups, or events such as "Loss of a Spouse" or "Surviving the Holidays" seminars), location type (in-person or virtual), time frame, day of the week, and distance. You can even click "Expand your search" to look for options that are farther away, if necessary.

If you don't have internet access, you can learn about GriefShare groups and events in your area by calling **1-800-395-5755**.

There are several new 13-week groups (as well as seminars) that begin in October (all online). If you'd prefer a group that meets in person, there are a few meeting in Naples that you may still join, even though they've already started.

A 13-week workbook costs \$15, and seminar booklets are \$5 each. The in-person groups can provide these at your first meeting, but online groups usually suggest that you order a copy from the publisher. All GriefShare materials are also available from the church office here at Wesley. (If you get yours from us, be sure to let your group facilitator know.)

UMCOR Update 2021

In 1820 the Methodist Church felt the nudge to start an official Missions arm that would share the Gospel and provide healing and support for needs at home and around the world. Among the primary concerns were starting medical, educational, and childcare facilities to minister to those in need.

As the church grew and the world changed, opportunities to reach previously untouched areas with the Gospel began to open. In the 1940's the Methodist Committee on Relief was officially formed, and one of the primary concerns was to lower the overhead costs so that any money given to a mission would go directly to that mission. To this end the church established "One Great Hour of Sharing" (now called UMCOR Sunday, usually in March). The purpose of this offering is to cover all administrative, staff, and distribution expenses so that when a person or a church give a donation to a special need (Hurricane relief, medical clinics, etc.), 100% of the gifts given will go directly to the need.

The church had renewed emphasis upon both global and local missions, and found ways to cut costs while expanding the ministries. The official function of the Global Mission Board was to:

- 1) Make disciples of Jesus Christ;
- 2) Strengthen, develop, and renew Christian congregations and communities;
- 3) Alleviate human suffering; and
- 4) Seek justice, freedom, and peace.

This continues to be our goal to this day – we have missionaries and outposts in over 60 countries worldwide, and including hurricane relief efforts in our own country.

TRIP TO THE HOLY LAND PLANNED FOR MARCH 2022



LAY SERVANT MINISTRIES is a **leadership development program** in The United Methodist Church, **focused on equipping and empowering** laypersons who have responded to the call of God to serve in mission and ministry, and live out their own discipleship as servants in leadership through the ministries of **leading**, **caring**, **and communicating**.

Through this equipping and empowering system, lay servants have the opportunity to grow as disciples of Jesus Christ and who then go and make other disciples.

To become a Certified Lay Servant, you must:

- 1. Obtain recommendation from the pastor and the church council or charge conference of the local church
- 2. Complete "Introduction to Lay Ministries: BASIC Course."
- 3. Complete an advanced Lay Servant Ministries course.

In the **Basic LSM course** - which is the prerequisite for becoming a Certified Lay Servant - you will gain clarity around your talents and the needs of your community. You'll also reconnect with our United Methodist history and faith and learn how to reach out to others.

David Palmer, Director of the North Central District Lay Servant Ministries, will lead the **Basic Lay Servant Ministries** course online **NOVEMBER 1-15**. Easy and doable even if you are new to online learning, the two-week class will consist of 3 Zoom meetings of small groups and worship sessions.

The first Zoom meeting for this course will be held Monday, November 1, 6:00-7:30 pm EDT. The second and third meeting days/time will be scheduled with learner input during meeting 1. Contact David at (352) 598-9823 or at ncdayservant@gmail.com with any questions.

Faith Builds Invitation

Hello Faith Build Partners,

Thanks to your support of the 2021 Thrivent Faith Builds Generosity Challenge, one more family will know the security and stability of owning a home of their own. Your financial commitment is making it possible for us to unlock the \$100,000 grant offered by Thrivent to fund half the cost of one home in our newest community, Whitaker Woods. Building is underway on 125 two- story homes, ranging in size from 1,250 to 1,550 square feet, located in 3 and 4-unit multi-family buildings. Families will begin purchasing their homes in Fall 2021. The community is expected to be completed by Spring 2023.

This year there is no requirement for volunteers to build on our jobsite. However, our jobsites are open and we invite members of your congregation to join us for a Faith Builds Volunteer Day from 8 am to noon. There are still risks from the Corona virus, so we ask people to mask when indoors or in close proximity to others. We ask that volunteers not share tools and properly clean all tools when through. We respectfully request that if anyone is not feeling well or if they have been in contact with someone who has the virus that they not come to the jobsite.
