Pastor's Letter

I miss playing "Muggins".

For those of you who don't know, "Muggins" is an old card game with a special deck of cards in which you are trying to deplete your pile by playing either on another person's pile or on the stacks of cards in the center. If you have a valid play and you don't make it, whoever shouts "MUGGINS!" first gets to take one of their cards and add it to your pile!

It's a noisy, frantic game. I was taught it by Grandma Foster, my mother's mother. She took a wicked delight in just sitting there quietly, waiting for you to make a mistake, so that she could shout it out and laugh with glee!

As the years went on my grandma died, but my mother and I would still play. We played other games, too – "Liverpool Rummy", "Upwords", "Triominos".

But over the past two years, my mother has been losing her memory. At first we chalked it up to her not wearing her hearing aids, but it's more than that. Her basic concept of what is real and what isn't has begun to decline.

I came across the scripture the other day where the Jewish leaders were questioning John the Baptist - "Who are you? Are you Elijah?" He said, "I am not." "Are you the Prophet?" He answered, "No." Finally they said, "Who are you? Give us an answer to take back to those who sent us. What do you say about yourself?"

"Who are you?" There's really more to that question than meets the eye. It's not just about your existential identity – it's a question about "Why should I listen to you? What is your connection to my life?" My mother has begun questioning that. As she declines in her mental abilities, her emotions become more raw and she becomes desperate to find a stable point again.

I started thinking about this in relationship to our church. My mother gets anxious when current reality doesn't fit with her memories, and she needs reassurance. Those of us who are connected with reality try to find a way to reassure her of her value and her place in the world.

As a church, we are called to do the same thing. "Who are we, as Wesley United Methodist Church on Marco Island? What does our community need from us, and how can God use us to help them find their place in His family?"

I know it's not quite the same thing, but it's helpful to remember that, if we are connected with God, then we can connect to those who are lost. Many of them may not even know that they are lost, the way that my mother will argue with you that she knows exactly where she is and what she's doing. And my sisters and I don't respond to my mother with anger or belittling her. We offer love and support the best we can.

That's what our community needs from us right now. So much has changed in the world and in our church that there is no option for trying to do ministry the way we used to. That worked for that time, but we are all now different. There is a different anxiety out there, a different daily life. God has not changed – but the way He offers His hope and healing is constantly changing to meet today's needs.

I read the scripture recently, "The fields are ripe for the harvest." Right now, right here, in this community, in this context, there are people anxiously looking for something to hold onto! The Spirit of Jesus Christ is calling to them, and He invites us to join Him in bringing them home!

I miss the old ways. I miss the old conversations I used to have with my mother. I miss playing "Liverpool Rummy" and "Muggins" with her.

But this is our life now, and I will love her and rejoice in those moments when we can connect. And I look forward to the day when we will be together, with clarity of hearts and minds in Jesus.


In addition, an online "Loss of a Spouse" seminar (only one session, specifically for widows and widowers) will be held on Tuesday, July 27 at 6:30 PM.




You'll need a workbook for GriefShare (\$15) and/or Loss of a Spouse (\$5), which can be ordered when you register.

Florida 2021 Annual Conference Summary Report

The Florida 2021 Annual Conference was held June 11 and 12 via Zoom. Several topic sessions were available to the participants June 6 – June 10th along with the normal "Pre Conference" sessions conducted both by the Fl. Conf. and the Districts. Your Lay Delegate (Chuck Nelson) and Rev. Bill attended the Annual Conference.

Some key points:

Well run Conference and we all continue to enjoy the time saved by using the Zoom voting. Votes were presented, taken, counted and reported within minutes vs at least 15 minutes or more under the old process used at the last in person Conference in 2019. Well attended — over 1,200 participants. Cost savings vs "in person" but for me, I miss the "in person" feeling, excitement and side conversations of the "in person" conference.

Bishop Carter conducted a Pre Conference session on the future of our church:

- a. Anticipated business at the **next General Conference Aug 27 Sept. 7, 2022** is expected to vote on the question of LGBTQ marriages and clergy which some feel will cause some local churches to leave the United Methodist Church or lose members.
- b. He wants all of us to understand there is no rush to do anything and no one is being asked to leave or vote on anything. Relax and let GOD and some time do its good work. We want everyone to stay. No one is being asked to leave.
- c. Traditional pastors will continue to be assigned to more traditional local churches and more progressive pastors will be assigned to more progressive local churches.
- d. The COVID pandemic has caused a pause in the discussion.
- e. It is possible the General Conference, planned for 2022, could be again postponed as COVID is causing greater problems in other parts of the World and we are only one part of our World church.
- f. When having discussions in the local church, have these discussions in the open and always present and discuss the different views.
- e. This session with Bishop Carter was recorded and will be available on the Conference web site.

Our Conference Bishop gave an impressive opening to the Conference by focusing on the word "WE" and tied it to a repeated topic of this Annual Conference:

"Every person WE encounter was created in the image of GOD."

Bishop Carter is starting his 10th year as our Conference Bishop and has recently been appointed to also serve as the Bishop for the Western NC Conference. Because of his travel needs, the Bishop's current home in Lakeland (owned by the Conference) was approved to be sold.

FOUR MAIN INITIATIVES:

- a. Dismantling Racism -Bishop Carter feels this must be a major thrust for us
- b. Viable Local Churches (includes more effort in "Fresh Expressions")
- c. Finishing "<u>Fill the Table"</u> goal was to provide 3 mil. meals and we have reached over 5 million plus. Local churches are encouraged to continue helping provide food for people in need.
- d. <u>Clergy Care</u> ---- was established to help our clergy who are under new pressures added because of COVID pandemic. Grants are still available to help our clergy with their physical and mental health. Program will end this year.

Conference Budget:

- a. 391 of our local churches gave 100% of their apportionments. We are part of the 391!!!
- b. The approved 2022 budget is down \$478,000 from 2021. Budget reduction of over \$4.5 million or more than a 21% decrease since 2017.

Local Church discontinuances and disaffiliations:

6 local churches were approved for discontinuation and 3 for disaffiliation.

<u>Resolutions</u>: Note: Resolutions are an expression of feeling at the Conference and while they are presented to encourage thinking or action to be in line with the vote of the Conference participants, they only apply to that Conference year and are not binding on the local churches. Most resolutions are submitted by clergy or lay conference delegates and may represent positions which are contrary to those of the Florida Conference.

- a. QAnon Movement: Voted to not support QAnon Movement 57% in favor.
- b. Non-Binary Gender for Church Statistics Reporting: Voted to provide for designation of Female, Male and Non-Binary on church reporting forms. 52% in favor.
- c. Advocate for Use of Solar Energy for local churches: Voted to promote usage. 74% in favor.
- d. An anti abortion position: Voted to support this position. 58% in favor.
- e. Call for gender and racial equity in Clergy compensation: Voted to promote this position. 90% in favor.
- f. Accountability in Dismantling Racism: Voted in favor of this position. 61% in favor.

Note: There was a problem with some wording in the resolution which I believe reduced the number of "yes" votes. Overall I sensed a very strong backing for the Bishop's and Conference initiative to Dismantle Racism.

Several celebration and recognition services were held: Service of Remembrance, Local Pastor Recognition, Commissioning Service and the Ordination Service.
